



Plant Sure Four Ps

Tips for managing and maintaining your garden to reduce the risk of plants accidentally spreading into bushland.

P	LACE

Plant the right plant in the right place. This can avoid problems in the future.

- Avoid planting spreading vines along a bushland boundary.

 Plant non-invasive screening plants instead.
- O Look for the eco-label to find the right plant.
- () Keep vigorous indoor plants such as Monstera in their pot and inside!



P RUNE

Stop the next generation of plants growing from seed and stop the spread.

- Prune before your plant develops its seeds, or fruits if spread by birds.
- Prune areas of vigorous growth or height to stop plants from escaping over fences.
- Dispose of any cuttings or pruned vegetation responsibly.
- Research your plant to find the best advice on how and when to prune.



P OT

Them up as another way to manage opportunities for a high-risk plant to spread.

- Try potting it up and move it indoors.
- Plant it in a restricted garden bed to deter root spread.
- () Keep it on a patio or indoors to reduce risk even further.
- Dispose of potted plants responsibly and avoid planting them in the garden.
